Bischwiller, France

- 1 1000 - - - - - Bn and attachments began mt'd road march from Battenfeld to Bischwiller. (For route of march see overlay).
- 2 1200 - - - - - Tail of column closed in completely at Bischwiller. Troops dismounted from vehicles, vehicles returning to assembly area vic Marienthal (see overlay). Awaiting to occupy Oberhoffen and hold when town has been taken by friendly troops.
- 3 1215 CCB 68 CP (Via Ln O). Request location of companies and positions in Bischwiller.
- 4 1235 CCB 68 CP (Via Ln O). Plotted positions of companies (see overlay).
- 5 1235 CCB 68 CP Make reconnaissance of bridges being repaired at (09541876).
- 6 1245 I&R Patrol departed on above rcn mission.
- 7 1330 I&R 68 CP Both bridges are OK; one treadway and one 40-ton bridge. Treadway brg at (10261840) and 40-ton brg at (09541876). Engrs report 40-ton brg will hold anything we have.
- 8 1345 CCB 68 CP approx 6 rds Nebelwerfer fell vic (091191).
- 9 1400 CCB 68 CP Have CO 68 and CO-B25 report to CCB without delay.
- 10 1415 CCB 68 CP CO 68 returned to CP with orders for B-25 Tks to move to SE corner of Bischwiller, atk woods at NE edge of Oberhoffen, and return as soon as mission is accomplished. To begin immediately in order to relieve pressure on Oberhoffen.
- 11 1425 CCB 68 CP On above mission, tks may fire into NE edge of Oberhoffen.
- 12 1448 CCB 68 CP CCB: Has B-25 left yet and have you had any reports from them yet? 68: They left at 1437 and no reports from them yet. We have good communication with them.
- 13 1458 CCB 68 CP 68: Have you jumped off? B-25: Are now between Ck Pts "A" & "C" (See Sketch of Oberhoffen).
- 14 1503 B-25 68 CP Have jumped off; on way to Ck Pt "B".
- 15 1512 B-25 68 CP Safe to fire vic Ck Pts 5, 9, 10, I, H, E.
- 16 1525 CCB 68 CP Can you give positions?
- 17 1526 B-25 68 CP What is your position?
- 18 1538 CCB 68 CP No troops N of Ck Pt F and G.
- 19 1541 B-25 68 CP Safe to fire W and E of Line I, H, G & F.
- 20 1555 B-25 68 CP Receiving fire from friendly vehicles. Can you do anything about it?
- 21 1559 CCB 68 CP White clad troops moving from (097206) along edge of woods to main road leading NE out of Oberhoffen. They are dropping 2 or 3 men off at intervals as though going into defensive positions.
- 22 1602 B-25 68 CP Friendly fire has stopped.
- 23 1610 B-25 68 CP Is everything in town?
- 24 1620 B-25 68 CP (Intercept from B-25) 68: One tk has been knocked out and B-25 is moving to withdraw. CCB: Order them to press on.
- 25 1621 B-25 Continue on your mission.
- 26 1630 B-25 Orders from CCB are to continue atk.
- 27 1635 B-25 Impossible to continue mission.

- 28 1638 B-25 68 CP CO, B-25 returned to 68 CP; tks have returned and are just other side of creek in Bischwiller.  
29 1715 CCB 68 CP (Via Ln O) One tk of B-25 knocked out at coord (105198). 2 plats tks reached points (102197) and (105198). Entire 25 Tk Bn ordered to move to find atk position in Bischwiller.  
30 1715 T&R OP 68 CP One ey tk painted white moving S on road at edge of woods vic (103205) at 1715.  
31 1730 68 OP CCB Above info.  
32 - - - - - Arranging for patrol to evacuate wounded man in knocked out B-25 Tk at (105198).  
33 1745 I&R OP 68 CP From mag. az. of 65 deg. from OP (08741920) can observe gun flashes; shells apparently landing vic bridge at (095188); approx 8 rds between 1735 and 1745. About 3 seconds between gun flashes and time shell falls vic bridge.  
34 1800 68 CP CCB Above info.  
35 1900 CCB 68 CP Ey believed to be laying minefield from cross-roads vic (1020) to the E. Info rec'd by CCB at 1830.  
36 1915 CCB 68 CP Atch one plat riflemen to D-94 tonight only for security; to re-inforce D-94 guard.  
37 1920 68 CP - - - Patrol consisting of 3 riflemen, 1 tanker, one aid man, and 3 litter bears left, after obtaining clearance from adjacent units, to recover wounded man in knocked out B-25 tk.  
38 2145 - - - - 68 CP Report of patrol to B-25 knocked out tk: Left approx 1915 but were constantly pinned down by ey fire and were unable to get to within 400 yds of tk, but could not get to tk to evacuate wounded man because of intense ey fire.  
39 2155 68 CP CCB Above info.  
40 2230 EX C-68 C.O. Check T&R OP's every hour for latest info.  
41 2240 T&R OP 1 68 CP Green amber flare seen in vic of ey.  
42 2300 OP #1 68 CP Heard one unidentified tk on right of OP.  
43 2305 OP #2 68 CP No report.  
44 2400 OP #1 68 CP No report.

PLAN FOR DEFENSE OF SAESSOLSHEIM

1. Outpost system (See overlay). Outposts manned twenty-four hours per day. Two man roving patrols operate over route shown on overlay from 1830 until 0630. Mission of patrol is to keep all civilians off the streets, enforce blackout regulations, and guard against acts of sabotage.
2. Assembly area in case of alert (See overlay). In case of alert all company commanders will immediately report to Battalion CP for instructions, or in event time does not permit companies will be prepared to dispatch their troops to positions shown on overlay #2. Hq Co will be prepared to support rifle companies from positions within the town.
3. In case of infiltration by enemy at night all troops will fight for their own houses and court-yards, firing on anyone in street. All personal weapons and an ample supply of ammunition will be kept in billets. Maximum use will be made of vehicular automatic weapons.
4. In case of enemy air activity all vehicles and troops will seek cover and concealment and not fire on planes unless they display hostile action, and then only on order from a commissioned officer. .50 cal. anti-aircraft mounts will be kept available and each platoon will select positions offering good fields of fire for this weapon.



B-25 Tk Bn atchd.

4. WEATHER AND VISIBILITY:

Weather: Cloudy with continuous rain.  
 Visibility: Poor.

5. OUR OPERATIONS FOR THE PERIOD:

Launched attack on Oberhoffen at 0730 from positions in southern part of town in an effort to clear northern part of town of ey. Troops advanced slowly under intense ey automatic wpns fire, followed by intense hvy ey arty and mortar fire. Advance continued slowly as troops had to search each house for ey possibly hiding in basements. Ey strong point seemed to be NW of church. For furthest point reached by troops see atchd sketch of Oberhoffen. For defensive positions for night see sketch atchd. 68 plus B-25 relieved from CCB control and passed to control of 142d RCT at 1400.

6. COMBAT EFFICIENCY: Excellent.

7. RESULTS OF OPERATION:

Troops successful in clearing houses in considerable portion of town and established new defensive positions for the night.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

RECAPTURE: Patrol left observer in house at (9322772) to observe for enemy activity in woods vic (932278) and along road running N through woods. Patrol leader sent 2 men into edge of woods vic (932278) to protect them from surprise from that direction. Patrol proceeded through woods along left side of road to vic (9322786). Patrol leader sent two men along creek to vic (9322820). From there they got fleeting glimpse of one enemy moving S. Patrol continued from there until it reached vic (93228200). From there they could hear voices speaking in very low tones to across their whole front. They observed from this position but could see no movement. Observer left in house near Rd and one enemy crossed fr N side of road and enter woods on S side of road. Patrol heard rifle fire fr woods vic (9322820). Patrol returned 1100.
